J.P. Nauseef
President & CEO, JobsOhio

As President and CEO, J.P. Nauseef leads a dedicated team responsible for business attraction, retention and expansion efforts across the state. J.P. has significant executive leadership experience in the private, public and nonprofit sectors.

# Priorities for the State Operating Budget (House Bill 33)

## **CURRENTLY IN THE LEGISLATION TO PRESERVE**

Historic Preservation Tax Credit

 Extends a temporary \$120 million increase in the amount of historic building rehabilitation tax credits for FY 2025. The cap reverts to \$60 million in FY 2026.

#### PRIORITIES WE ARE ASKING BE AMENDED INTO LEGISLATION

Brownfield Remediation Program Funding- \$500 Million

 NAIOP of Ohio appreciates the House's allocation of \$350 Million over the biennium. However, due to increased demand, we are requesting \$500 Million for FY 24 & 25 total.

Building Demolition and Site Revitalization Program Funding - \$250 Million

 NAIOP of Ohio appreciates the House's allocation of \$150 Million in Fiscal Year 2024. However, due to increased demand, we are requesting \$250 Million for FY 24 & 25 total.

Transformational Mixed-Use Development (TMUD) Tax Credit- \$200 Million

• Authorize the Tax Credit Authority to approve up to \$200 million per fiscal year in tax credits to property owners and investors in TMUD projects compared to the \$100 million per fiscal year approved previously.

Opportunity Zone Tax Credit- Increase to \$50 Million the Allocation for Fiscal Year 2025

 Over \$43 million was applied for in the most recent round of that Program, based upon a year's-worth of investments.

Updating the Requirements for Electronic Means of Recording Instruments

 Originally House Bill 237 of the 134th General Assembly, this language would modernize Ohio's system of recording instruments, improve, and streamline the ability to complete real estate transactions.

### Proportional JVSD Compensation for Property Tax Exemptions

 Clarify that a joint vocational school district (JVSD) shall receive compensation in proportion to how the JVSD is allocated property tax revenue funding relative to the traditional school district.

### TIF Exemption Commencement

• Clarify that tax increment financing (TIF) exemptions can begin on a parcelby-parcel basis by the earlier of (i) the tax year in which the value of an improvement exceeds a specified amount or (ii) a certain year.

### **TIF Process Simplification**

For non-school TIFs (i.e., those in which school districts receive TIF
revenue equal to what they otherwise would receive in property tax
revenue), simplify all of the TIF statutes to eliminate (i) the requirement that
the school district board of education approve the TIF and (ii) the school
district notice requirements.

# **Other Pending Legislation**

### Supportive: Senate Bill 3 (Schuring)

Creates the Ohio Community Revitalization Program, authorizing nonrefundable income tax credits for undertaking community projects.

Status: In the Senate Ways & Means Committee

### Supportive: Senate Bill 41 (Roegner)

Allows for expedited appeals to the Ohio Board of Building Appeals and county and municipal boards of building appeals.

Status: Passed Ohio Senate Unanimously; Sent to House for Consideration
